File Format

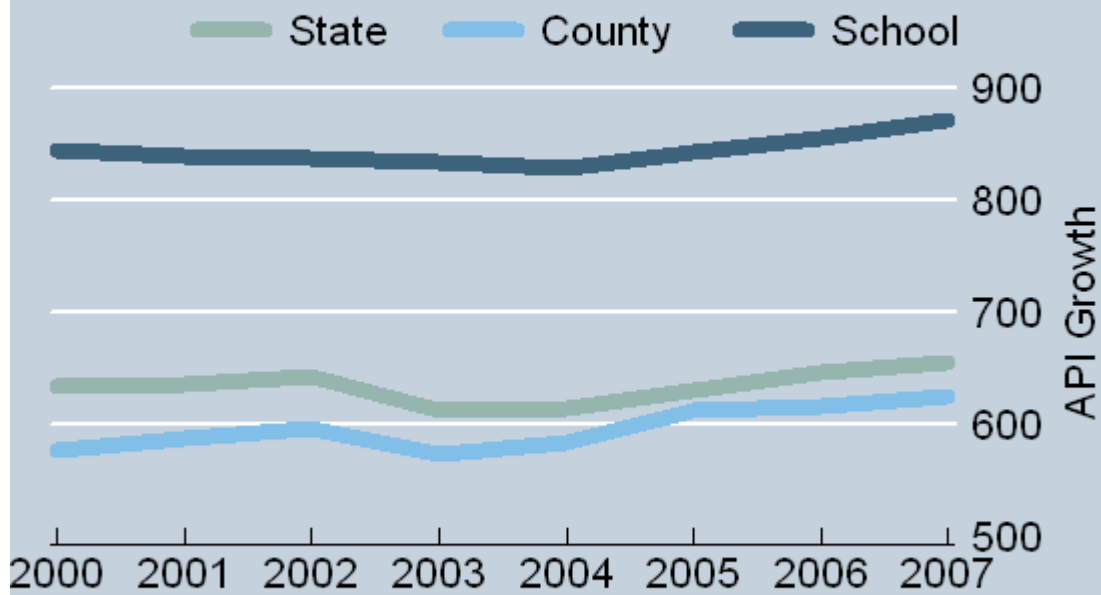

API Growth Since 2000

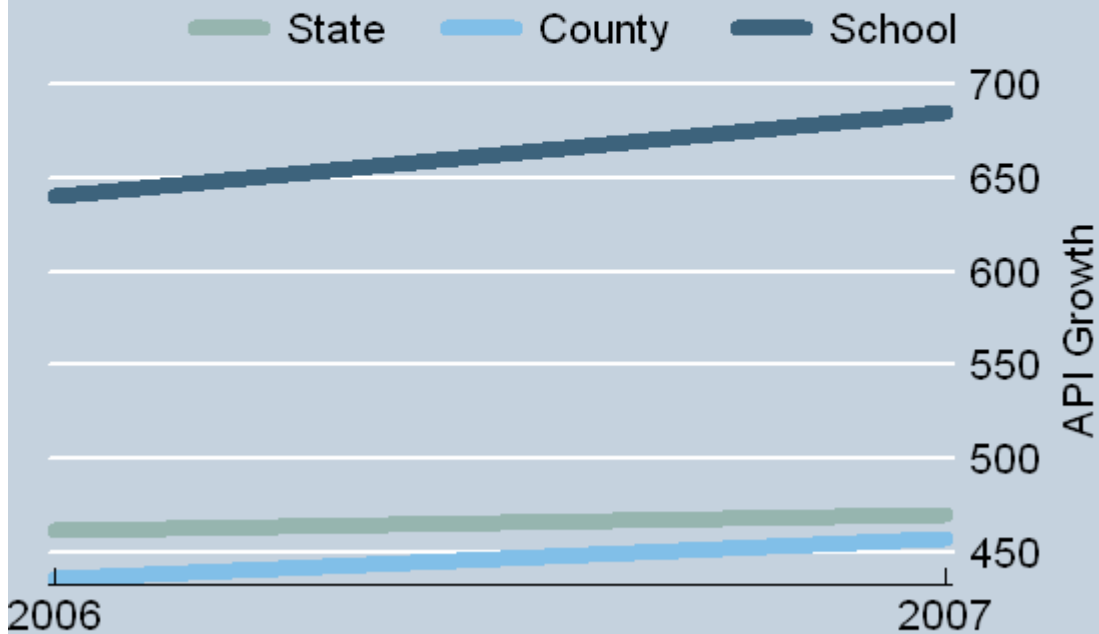

Students with Disabilities API Growth Since 2006

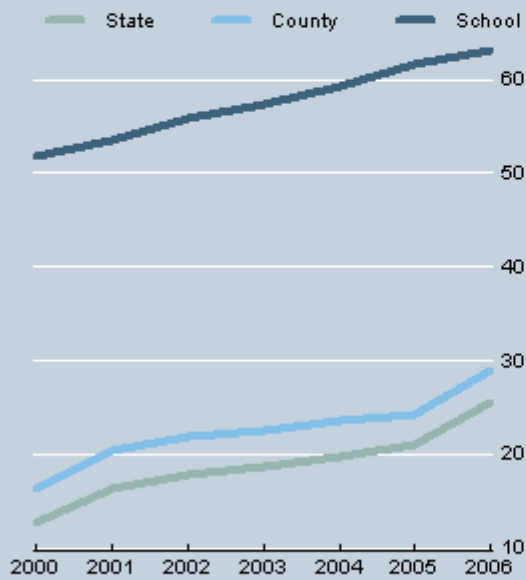

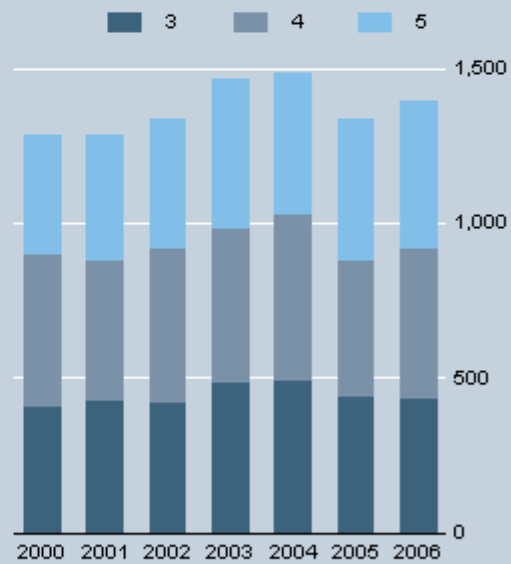

Number of test takers divided by 11th and 12 grade enrollment

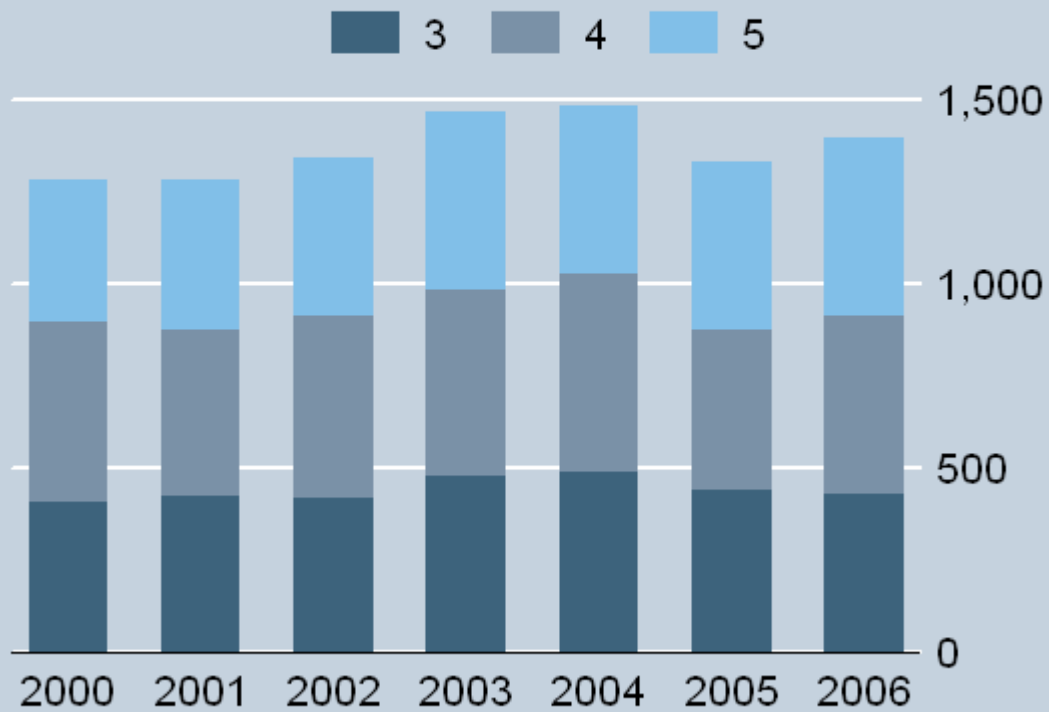
AP Scores

Advanced Placement Scores

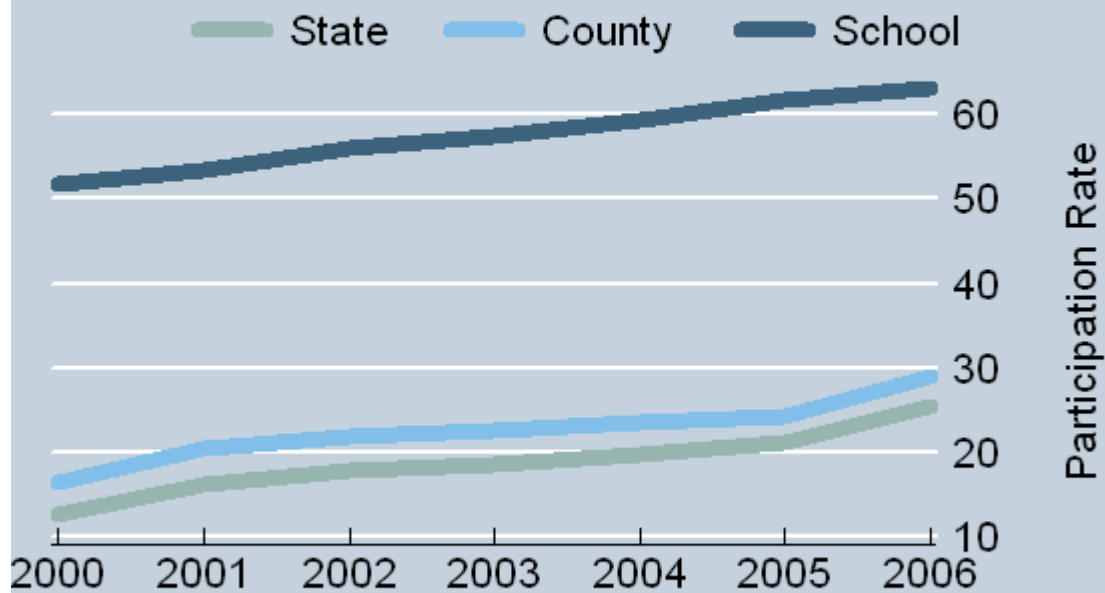
